FORT KNOX, Ky. - The command team of the 100th Training Division (Leader Development), Brig. Gen. Aaron Walter and Command Sgt. Maj. Gregory Betty, are part of the 260 senior leaders selected by US Army Senior Leadership for initial fielding of the Army Greens service uniform.

To ensure the US Army presents a professional appearance, the Army is adopting the iconic Greens uniform as its new service uniform. This is the uniform worn by America's Greatest Generation as

they won World War II. Now, America's Next Greatest Generation will wear it as they develop

into the smart, thoughtful, and innovative leaders of character outlined in the Army Vision.

"Every June 6 is an opportunity to pay tribute to those who fought in WWII for the liberation of Europe," said Betty. "It is an honor to have been selected for this initial fielding. This uniform has a powerful identification with the Greatest Generation that will inspire today's Soldiers and enhance esprit de corps."

Betty was fitted for his uniform a few months ago and had it quickly tailored. His instructions were to wear it to events and engagements in order to receive feedback. Over this past week, Betty addressed numerous classes being conducted by the 83rd US Army Reserve Readiness Training Center here at Fort Knox. During these engagements, Betty explained to Soldiers the Army Greens uniform will become the everyday service uniform for all Soldiers. This will allow the current Blue Army Service Uniform (ASU) to return to a more formal

dress uniform role, and the Army Combat Uniform, also known as the Operational Camouflage Pattern

(OCP), to be the Army's combat/field uniform. This style of uniform is one of the most admired and recognizable uniforms in the Army's history and these engagements have demonstrated positive support. In order to sustain an all-volunteer force, the American people must have confidence in the Army's professionalism and readiness.

"Readiness determines our ability to fight and win our nation's wars and is the Army's first priority," said Betty. "Throughout its history, the 100th Division has stood out in its ability to adapt to changes in military requirements, and the reintroduction of this uniform will build upon this legacy by inspiring trust and confidence in our Soldiers' professionalism and readiness."

Applications for College Scholarships for 100th Division MG Benjamin J. Butler "Century Division" Scholarship Program

Interested in a \$1,000 Scholarship for your Children or Grandchildren? Read below and complete the application of your child qualifies.

Nomination form/applications for scholarship grants may be submitted for or by qualified individuals who are pursuing a four-year degree program at an accredited college or university. One or more scholarship grants may be made annually from the MG Benjamin J. Butler "Century Division" Scholarship Fund (hereinafter "Fund") which is managed by The Community Foundation of Louisville (hereinafter "Foundation").

Scholarship assistance from the Fund shall be used to help defray the full cost or any portion of the cost of any or all of the following: (1) tuition; (2) books; (3) academic fees; (4) room and board expenses for housing made available through the educational institution; and (5) any equipment purchased through the university. Each grant will be at least \$1,000 and will be made payable to the educational institution. All grants will be awarded on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis per the Scholarship Endowment Fund Agreement with The Community Foundation of Louisville.

Eligibility for consideration is based on the following guidelines and will be validated by the AOC initial selection committee:

1. Nominee for the scholarship must be: 1) an active, retired or former member of the United States Army 100th Infantry Division or any of its successor designations, including, but not limited to the 100th Division (Training) or its successor designations such as 100th Division (Operational Support); or 2) be a direct lineal descendant of one of the foregoing individuals; or 3) or be a legally adopted dependent of one of the foregoing individuals.

2. Nominated individual must be in the senior year of high school or a high school graduate and must have been accepted for admission to an institution of higher education. Applicants must have a minimum of a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale.

After having met the above requirements, the selection committee established by the Foundation will make the final selection of the winning applicant/applicants based upon (1) demonstrated financial need; (2) qualities of good citizenship and patriotism, as indicated by community service, leadership positions, and/or letters of recommendation; (3) other letters of recommendation; and (4) demonstrated academic excellence.

3. The following documentation, as applicable, must be included in the applicant's nominating packet:

- * American College Test (ACT) Score and/or Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) Score
- * Grade Point Average (GPA) (include High School Transcript)
- * Membership in National Honor Societies
- * Honors and Awards Received
- * Membership in Junior ROTC
- * Extra Curricular Activities, Community Activities and/or Military Achievement
- * A typed essay of 250 words on "How This Scholarship Will Help Me Achieve My Goals" signed by the applicant.

Nominating packets for eligible individuals must be sent to The Association of the Century, Inc., Attn: "Century Division" Scholarship Committee, P.O. Box 34393, Louisville, KY 40232 not later than June 1st of the year of consideration and include the required documentation listed in paragraph 3 above.
