THE CHAIRMAN'S FOXHOLE MG Bill Barron, USA Retired



Private Roy Sees, World War II 100th Infantry Division Soldier

We are deeply honored to have had Roy Sees, age 102, attend this Annual Meeting.

During the first years of World War II, Mr. Sees was one of about 150 Army Air Cadet students at Texas A&M University. Following the D-Day Invasion of France, the United States needed large numbers of additional soldiers, so it closed all university, Cadet, Air Cadet, OCS and other military related training young American men were undergoing and drafted them into the various services. As he was in the Army Air Cadet program, he was drafted into the Army and assigned as an infantryman in the 100th as were most of his fellow Texas A&M Air Cadet students.

Mr. Sees was a rifleman in the 100th Infantry Division in World War II in the invasion through France, serving with Company L, 399th Infantry Regiment. He received a Bronze Star and two Purple Hearts and the French Medal of Honor in the campaign.

Many years ago, he was visiting the 100th Division Headquarters in Louisville, KY, when Division Commander MG Butler invited him to join AOC and he did. Upon his return from Europe to the United States, he was discharged. He believes all of the fellow soldiers with whom he served have now passed away.

Mr. Sees wanted to make this year's Annual Meeting while he was in good health, so he has his son and grandson drive him to Bowling Green for this memorial gathering. He now lives in Belfrey, OH, but the weather is too cold for him! He'd like to return to the desert in Phoenix, AZ, where he formerly lived.

MG Benjamin Butler Past Award Winner: Newly Commissioned Ensign Bray Zimmerman Returns her first Salute to Grandfather SGM (R) Ben Zimmerman

Ensign (2d LT) Bray Zimmerman, granddaughter of retired SGM Ben Zimmerman and Renie Zimmerman,

Bray graduated from the United States Naval Academy in May 2021. She is a past winner of the MG Benjamin J. Butler Scholarship Award. Her major was ocean engineering and graduated in the top 5% of the class (49 of 1084) and was considered a Distinguished Midshipmen Graduate.

She commissioned as an Ensign in the Surface Warfare Engineering Duty Officer/Dive Officer community. She chose the USS Arleigh Burke which is currently stationed in Rota, Spain. Before she goes to her ship, she will complete her training to become a Dive Officer. She is attending dive school at Naval Dive and Salvage Training Center Panama City, Florida. After this training she will attend training for becoming a Surface Warfare Officer in Norfolk, Virginia. In the spring of 2022, she will then travel to Rota, Spain. After 38 months of being assigned to a ship, she will continue her education by obtaining a master's degree at Naval Post Graduate School (NPS) in Monterey, California or Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in Boston. After completing this degree, she will be an Engineering Duty Officer.
