## THE CHAIRMAN'S FOXHOLE MG Bill Barron, USA Retired

Welcome to our first AOC e-newsletter and Happy Holidays to all!

First, let me explain the above pictures. On Thursday, 30 November I attended a deployment ceremony at Fort Knox for some 30 soldiers and civilians from the 1st Theater Support Command who are heading to Kuwait for a 6 month rotation. The 1<sup>st</sup> TSC, stationed at Ft. Knox since August of this year has a mascot by the name of CPL Jack Blackjack, pictured above with yours truly and PVT Vasquez, a 1st TSC Soldier and yes, that is me on the left side of the photo. So you are asking yourself what does this have to do with the Century Division? Here's the rest of the story. Many of you remember LTC (R) Arvil Dobson who spent many years serving in different sections at the 100<sup>th</sup> Division HQ's in Louisville. Arvil now lives in the Simpsonville area and in a business partnership with past 100<sup>th</sup> Division Engineer LTC (R) Kathy Krantz, has the ability to board and care for large animals like CPL Blackjack who weighs around 750 lbs. When the 1<sup>st</sup> TSC was moving from Fort Bragg to Fort Knox they put a bid out to find someone in the area here to board and take care of CPL Blackjack and LTC Dobson got the job. CPL Blackjack now travels back and forth from Simpsonville to Fort Knox in style, trailered by Arvil and Kathy to Fort Knox when his presence is needed for 1st TCS Ceremonies and summoned by MG Donnie Walker, Commanding General, 1st TSC.

Make no mistake CPL Jack "Huck" Blackjack, now 13 years old, is no ordinary Soldier. Trained as a pack mule in North Carolina, he can haul supplies and goods on a trail, up a mountain and through the woods. His large ears, silky brown hair and jet black hooves, while not spit-shined, make him stand out in any military formation. Much like his First TSC teammates, CPL Blackjack is used to doing the heavy lifting and getting the job done as a valued member of the First Team. Mules as Unit Mascots began in 1899 when an officer at the Philadelphia Quartermaster Depot decided the Army needed something to counter the Navy goat for the 1899 rivalry game between the two service academies. Dr. Kim Krivit, doctor of Veterinary Medicine who originally cared for then, PFC

Blackjack in North Carolina at the Northstar Veterinary Hospital in Parkton, N. C. was quoted as saying "When I first saw him as he got off the trailer he was just strikingly handsome. There are the George Clooneys of the equine world and he would definitely be on the cover of People Magazine" said Dr. Krivit with a smile on her face.

118 years later the tradition still continues thanks to the leadership of MG Donnie Walker and the magnificent soldiers of the 1<sup>st</sup> TSC, who with the help of CPL Blackjack do the heavy lifting for Americas Army!
