#### Association of the Century, Inc. Board of Directors' Meeting First Quarter Treasurer's Report May 9, 2023

- 1. For the first three months ended March 31, 2023, total receipts exceeded total disbursements for a positive increase in cash of \$5,679. Of significance was the receipt of \$3,500 in annual meeting sponsorships that included \$1,500 from Franklin Bank & Trust Company, \$1,000 from ATMOS, and \$1,000 from Thomas R. Hunt Auctioneers. The Association also received \$1,200 from Swope Auto Center for advertisements in the Sentinel. As of 31 March 2023, Total Net Assets were \$132,721.
- 2. The 2023 operating budget is included with the Statement of Receipts and Disbursements for the three months ended March 31, 2023, column c. The Board needs to approve this budget.
- 3. The State of Kentucky now requires the Association to electronically file quarterly state sales tax reports. Payments to the State are made by ACH bank transfer.
- 4. The General's "Franklin Club Challenge" as of April 30, 2023 has raised \$31,132 from 147 participants; \$22,327 has been designated to the Scholarship Fund, \$2,264 to the SOS Fund, \$1,291 to the Museum Fund and \$5,250 has been designated unrestricted. See the attached list of the 147 individuals who have participated in the "Franklin Challenge."
- 5. Total investments are \$119,327 at the end of the first quarter. All Certificates of Deposit (CD) are held at Abound Federal Credit Union; presently there are six (6) certificates. On March 19, 2023, CD #179152 for \$22,579 was renewed for 14 months at 4.43%. Interest income for the first quarter was \$604.
- 6. During the first quarter, the Support Our Soldiers (SOS) Program had no expenses and donations of \$50. The balance of Temporarily Restricted Assets for the program at the end of the first quarter was \$5,708.
- 7. The SOS Program was started in 2003; as of March 31, 2023 total donations were \$50,042 and expenditures were \$44,334. The balance of Temporarily Restricted Assets for the SOS Program at the end of 2022 was \$5,708.
- 8. During the first quarter, the Museum Fund received donations of \$25 and had no expenses. The balance of Temporarily Restricted Assets for the Museum on 31 March 2023 was \$3,307.
- 9. The financial activities for the MG Benjamin J. Butler "Century Division" Scholarship Fund for the first quarter of 2023 are outlined in the attached schedule. As of 31 March 2023, the fund balance is \$264,024.10.
- 10. The Scholarship Fund at the Community Foundation of Louisville (CFOL) has always been invested in the Signature Fund Program of the CFOL. The performance of the Signature Fund has been included with this Report.
- 11. Form 990-N for the calendar year ended December 31, 2022 was timely filed with the Internal Revenue Service in the first quarter of 2023.


In the first quarter, Ken Kapp made a donation of \$100.
