Association of the Century, Inc. Board of Directors' Meeting Second Quarter Treasurer's Report August 8, 2023

- 1. Cash receipts exceeded cash disbursements for the second quarter and the year to date ended June 30, 2023, by \$3,038 and \$8,717, respectively. Of significance in the second quarter were the receipts of \$4,218 in registration fees for the annual meeting, \$1,000 in annual meeting sponsorship from the Mint Gaming Home, and \$1,200 from Abound Federal Credit Union for Sentinel advertisements. Significant cash disbursements in the second quarter included \$1,485 in merchandise for resale, \$1,535 for two issues of the Sentinel, \$625 for 100 Challenge Coins, and \$900 donation to Reserve Organization Association for ROTC metals. As of 30 June 2023, Total Net Assets were \$135,958.
- 2. On June 7, 2023, the Kentucky Department of Charitable Gaming of the Public Protection Cabinet approved the Association of the Century to conduct charitable gaming activities. The Association has been assigned the exemption number of **EXE0002794**. The Association is required to print on all charitable gaming materials and correspondence their assigned exemption number. This includes raffle tickets and advertisements.
 - As required by the Gaming Department, the Association has opened a new bank account at Stock Yards Bank & Trust labeled "Gaming/Bingo." To maintain the exempt status, the Association will need to file the Annual Financial Report for Exempt Organization, Form CG-EFR, before January 31st each year for the previous calendar year.
- 3. The State of Kentucky now requires the Association to electronically file quarterly state sales tax reports. Payments to the State are made by ACH bank transfer. The last filing was for the quarter ending June 30, 2023.
- 4. The General's "Franklin Club Challenge" as of August 1, 2023 has raised \$31,132 from 147 participants; \$22,327 has been designated to the Scholarship Fund, \$2,264 to the SOS Fund, \$1,291 to the Museum Fund and \$5,250 has been designated unrestricted. See the attached list of the 147 individuals who have participated in the "Franklin Challenge."
- 5. Total investments are \$120,112 at the end of the second quarter. All Certificates of Deposit (CD) are held at Abound Federal Credit Union; presently there are six (6) certificates. Interest income for the second quarter was \$785.
- 6. During the second quarter, the Support Our Soldiers (SOS) Program had no donations and an expense of \$900. The expense was a single disbursement for a donation to the Reserve Organization Association for ROTC metals. The balance of Temporarily Restricted Assets for the program at the end of the second quarter was \$4,808.
 - The SOS Program was started in 2003; as of June 30, 2023 total donations were \$50,042 and expenditures were \$45,234. The balance of Temporarily Restricted Assets for the SOS Program at the end of 2022 was \$5,658.
- 7. During the second quarter, the Museum Fund received no donations and had no expenses. The balance of Temporarily Restricted Assets for the Museum on 30 June 2023 was \$3,307.

- 8. The financial activities for the MG Benjamin J. Butler "Century Division" Scholarship Fund for the first quarter of 2023 are outlined in the attached schedule. As of 30 June 2023, the fund balance is \$275,250.48. The "Funds Available For Grantmaking" are increased monthly by 1/12th of 5.0% of the trailing thirty-six month average of the Fund balance. The same Funds are decreased when funds are distributed for scholarships.
- 9. The Scholarship Fund at the Community Foundation of Louisville (CFOL) has always been invested in the Signature Fund Program of the CFOL. The performance of the Signature Fund has been included with this Report.

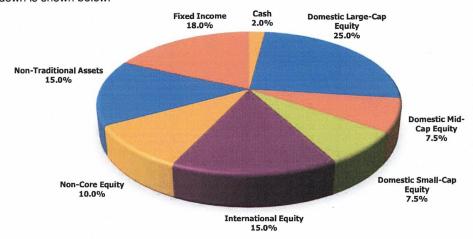

The Pool's Strategic Asset Allocation is 65% traditional equities, 15% non-traditional assets, 18% fixed income and up to 2% cash. A more detailed breakdown is shown below:
