On the 7th of December, 2024 the Association of the Century has been invited by BG Jung to participate in a Leader Development Program at the Division HQs which will feature the AOC at its best. Big plans for the afternoon of the 7th include a laydown of the Association's programs for the entire Headquarters to include our Scholarship program, our Museum program and our Corridor of the Century program. I have asked Ty Reid, the Director of the Patton Museum to do a "show and tell" of the WWII weapons that the AOC Museum has stored at the 100th Division. There will also be time available for quick tours of our Museum Cases as well as time to visit our "Supply Room" to purchase newly purchased items of clothing for the fall and winter months. We will also have a membership area set up for easy access to applications for annual and life memberships in the Association of the Century. To close the day, we will all go to the Sam Adams Brew House at 1700 for Happy Hour.

On Monday of that same week, the Association of the Century is helping the 100th Division sponsor it first iteration of the German Armed Forces Badge for Military Proficiency testing. This test must be administered by an actual German Physical Training Instructor and covers several physical training exercises much like our own physical training. It covers three days of time with the graduation being on Wednesday the 11th of December. The award, once issued, may be worn by any U.S. soldier, Officer or Enlisted, on his dress uniform. All 100th Division soldiers are eligible to participate in the competition for the award and I am told that there are over 300 individuals signed up to participate currently. This should be a great morale builder for members of the 100th Division!

This month at our Board Meeting we will pass the President's gavel from Wayne Gerding to Larry Able. I want to thank Wayne for his tireless efforts this year in leading the Association and to welcome Larry Able who assumes the role of President as we move into our second year in Owensboro. December 24, 1944, when the men of 'B' Company 399th Infantry Regiment, 100th Infantry Division, celebrated their Christmas with a big Christmas Dinner composed of roast turkey with dressing, cranberry sauce, creamed potatoes, pineapple, biscuits, mine meat pie, among other foods.

The Company History said: "The environment was different but the spirit the same. Packages were plentiful and the meal on Christmas was excellent. It was not as bad as expected here now."

With Kelly Fleck (B/399) saying: "Cooks brought up mermite cans of turkey and trimmings. Later someone brought up PX rations and beer (French)."





Corridor of the Century

It is time again to recommend Nominees for the Corridor of the Century. Nominations are due 1 June 2025. Nominees must have been truly outstanding in all phases of their Army careers and are no longer assigned to the 100th Division. Contributions by nominees to the excellence of the 100th Division is of primary importance and continued support of the Division is highly desirable. Any former 100th Division Soldier is eligible for nomination. As a minimum, each of the following categories shall be addressed, but nominations are certainly not limited to these areas:

- Years of service in the 100th Division
- Highest Rank Achieved
- Positions held in the 100th Division (and timed served in each, if available)
- Association of the Century Membership, Life or Annual.
- Decorations and awards,
- Extraordinary contributions to the 100th Division. (This category shall be expansive in narrative and specific in nature. This is the most important category in the determination of selectees.)
- Other Community Service
- 1. Nominations must be typed, single space, to include awards and decorations on one page, and should include an 8"x10" head and shoulders photo.

Veteran and Soldier Benefit Potential Spending Cuts or Increases before Congress

Veterans and presently serving soldier benefit increases or decreases in spending bills presently before Congress was the big topic briefed to the monthly Lexington area 100th Division and other veterans gathering on November 4, 2024, in Lexington. BG (R) Leslie Beavers, US Army, former Commissioner of the Kentucky Department of Veterans Affairs addressed more than 30 veterans about this topic.

Recent Tricare for Life pharmacy reductions are greatly impacting veterans with Walmart and Kroger having stopped accepting Tricare due to lower Government payments to them. Walgreens and CVS continue to accept Tricare but are reducing

the number of pharmacies across the US. Congress can increase Tricare pharmacy funding to address this issue.

He also emphasized veterans can participate in Tricare for Life's mail order pharmacy program whereby they can get about 90 days of prescription drugs mailed to their home without visiting a pharmacy.

Tricare dental coverage at no cost is in bills Congress is now considering.

Bills to increase presently serving younger active-duty soldier pay and Basic Allowance for Quarters (BAQ) are before Congress. All veteran organizations agree these need to be increased due to bigger costs of living, but Congress must pass laws to make them a reality.

General Beavers informed the group they should let their congressman and two Senators know their views on these important matters. Members of MOAA (Military Officers of America Association) can also report their views to MOAA at MOAA.forum.us

All veterans can search the MOAA site for updates in legislation at MOAA.forum.us. You do not have to be a member to review these issues on the website.
