AOC arranged for the Fort Knox TRADOC representative at Fort Knox to brief them and exhibit the AOC Museum's World War II weapons. Soldiers were able to make hands-on examination of various rifles, pistols, machine guns and a bazooka.

At the end of the day, AOC hosted a social hour for the soldiers at Sam Adams Brewhouse at Fort Knox. 100th soldiers and AOC board members met and talked about their careers. We learned that several present 100th soldiers are descendants of retired 100th soldiers. Several of the soldiers joined the AOC and will attend the 2025 Annual Meeting in Owensboro, KY, 22-24 August 2025.





AOC Supports 100th Division in Conducting German Army Proficiency Event

The 100th Training Division partnered with the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Germany to conduct a German Armed Forces Proficiency Badge (GAFPB) event Dec. 9-11 at Fort Knox, KY. See a photo above of the pistol competition.

The Association of the Century supported the 100th in this international event and 100th Commander BG Martin Jung provided the AOC the award above in appreciation of that support. The symbol of the award is that of the Bundeswehr, the German Federal Defense Force which includes the German Army, Navy, Air Force and all other armed forces.

“The German Armed Forces Proficiency Badge reflects partnership and excellence, and that’s what we really need,” said a German liaison officer at the event. “This badge is a partnership, wear it proud and know that you are part of Germany, part of the German Armed Forces.”

Candidates completed events such as a water survivability test, a physical fitness test, a written first aid test, 9 mm pistol qualifications and a seven-and-a-half-mile ruck while carrying a 33-pound rucksack.

Two hundred and thirty-eight candidates competed for a gold, silver or bronze badges. At the conclusion of the event, 15 gold, 76 silver and 65 bronze badges were awarded to successful candidates.

Any former 100th Division Soldier is eligible for nomination. As a minimum, each of the following categories shall be addressed, but nominations are certainly not limited to these areas:

- ☐ Years of service in the 100th Division
- ☐ Highest Rank Achieved
- ☐ Positions held in the 100th Division (and timed served in each, if available)
- ☐ Association of the Century Membership, Life or Annual.
- ☐ Decorations and awards,
- ☐ Extraordinary contributions to the 100th Division. (This category shall be expansive in narrative and specific in nature. This is the most important category in the determination of selectees.)
- ☐ Other Community Service

1. **Nominations must be typed, single space, to include awards and decorations on one page, and should include an 8"x10" head and shoulders photo.**

The Association of the Century, Inc. in partnership with The Community Foundation of Louisville, Inc. (the “Community Foundation”) administers and invests The MG Benjamin J. Butler “Century Division” Scholarship Fund (the “Scholarship Fund”). The Scholarship Fund is designed to provide scholarship assistance in the form of grants to help defray college or university expenses for selected eligible persons belonging to a class composed of active, retired, or former members of the 100th Division or their direct lineal descendants. Scholarship recipients are selected by an independent committee based upon (1) demonstrated financial need, (2) qualities of good citizenship and patriotism, (3) other letters of recommendation, and (4) demonstrated academic excellence.

The Scholarship Fund is a permanent endowment fund of the Community Foundation; but what happens if the “AOC” or any of its successor organizations cease to exist? When the Association ceases to exist, “such that it becomes impossible or impracticable to determine the members of the class of applicants to be benefitted by this endowment, the Community Foundation shall make distributions from the Scholarship Fund to support scholarships for active members of the United States Army Reserves or their children.”
