
I really do think that this Annual Reunion was a record setter across the board. For those of you that missed it, just mark Bowling Green into your calendar for next year in August!

Bingo is a fund raiser for AOC Scholarships.






To begin the Saturday evening banquet, the 100th Division's own Color Guard posted The Colors and the US Army Chorus performed The National Anthem on a large screen monitor.
